Hoċokata Ti Tour Scheduled for April 6

The Racial Justice teams of House of Hope and Valley of Peace have scheduled a field trip to Mdewakanton: Dwellers of Spirit Lake on Saturday, April 6, at 10:30 a.m. The 3,805-square-foot exhibit is a historical timeline shared through the eyes of the Mdewakanton Dakota people via storytelling, artifacts, and historical artifacts shared to enhance visitors' knowledge and understanding of Minnesota history and Native American culture.

The exhibit is at Hoċokata Ti (ho-cho-ka-tah-tee), the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community's cultural central and gathering space that is used to interpret and encourage traditional Mdewakanton Dakota cultural heritage, language, and history.

The one-hour tour can accommodate up to 75 people. The cost is \$8 for general admission, students 13 and up, and those 65 and up, are \$5.00 which can be paid for upon arrival. Free wheelchairs are provided upon request.

A Note from the Racial Justice Team

Dear Friends,

I can only speak for myself. But in my case, I am not a "self-made man." I did work hard to get where I am, but I am also a beneficiary of white privilege, class privilege, and male privilege.

I grew up in an all-white suburb with expensive homes and quality schools. This gave me a "leg-up" that many people do not have. It was like running a track race where my lane, unlike the others, did not have hurdles. I went to an excellent college, graduated without debt from education loans, and was admitted to a first-rate graduate school. By the time I completed my graduate education and applied for a job in academia, many other potential candidates had been forced to drop out of the competition at one point or another because of the hurdles they faced.

Only over time have I become aware of this. I learned from the words and actions of Martin Luther King, Jr. and from my own experiences living in a racially diverse community in New York. My eyes were opened to the problem of hunger, here and abroad, through my activities in Bread for the World and by reading books such as Ron Sider's Rich Christians in an Age of Hunger. And I continue to learn through my membership on Valley of Peace's Racial Justice Team and participation in this year's ISAIAH campaign, which focuses on issues such as affordable housing and youth programming.

Every person's story is different. What is yours? Have you faced barriers? How might this and other experiences inform your actions as you work toward removing some of the barriers faced by others? I believe these are questions worth considering.

<u>Where am I from? Get to know Pace!</u>

I've been here at Valley of Peace now for three months but I'm realizing I never took time to introduce myself in the Voice, so please accept this as a belated introduction--a get to know your new CYF director.

I was born among the rolling hills of Pennsylvania, the land of stoic German Lutheran immigrants, not too far from the town of Hershey which to this day on warm summer afternoons has its streets filled with the delicious scent of chocolate. I was held in the gnarled hands of my grandfather, Sterling Lentz, a World War II veteran turned barber, and my earliest memories are of my grandmother, Emma, as she would peel apples for me in her hospice bed in one swirling twist of apple skin that fascinated and delighted my young imagination. I was baptized on Reformation Sunday, my baptism connecting me to the community of saints of our shared Lutheran heritage that began with a German monk saying "Here I stand" on behalf of the poor and marginalized, a heritage we all share and continue to proclaim.

I am heir to another heritage, too, that of the LGBTQIA+ community whose history is found along the margins of society, of men and women and nonbinary and gender non-conforming folk who would meet in dark alleys to share in moments of intimacy and love which were deemed too unseemly for mainstream society, even though love and loss and desire and longing form the common currency of all human experience. My ancestors were the poets Sappho and Lord Byron, Oscar Wilde and Audre Lorde, Emily Dickinson and Walt Whitman. My foreparents the black and brown trans women who rioted at Stonewall and Compton's Cafeteria, the martyrs of my community the gay men and trans women who died of AIDS related complications as society turned away.

My name is Pace, a name I chose for myself, which is a nod to yet another heritage–my mother's Italian lineage. Pace in Italian (pronounced pah-che) means peace, and my name is as much a promise as it is a commitment. In English pace reminds me to continue moving, to grow and change, to keep the pace as I follow the divine's movement in my own life.

I have worked in churches for over twenty years and have written faith-based curriculum for nearly ten years. I love to teach--in fact, that might be my greatest passion in life. I've taught kids of all ages, college courses, graduate courses, but through it all, the one thing I hope all students who come across a class taught by Pace, whether it's part of Children's Faith Formation or a sermon I preach or a youth group I lead, is that who you are, as you are, is loved beyond measure by God and that you, as you are right now, are deserving of a safe community to call home.

This is but a snapshot of who I am, of the hands that shaped and formed me, the heritage that I was born into and chosen from. I bear the scars and sacrifices of my communities past, and am buoyed by their overwhelming love. I am Pace and this is the legacy that I carry of where I am from as I continue to grow into who I will become.
