

A Note from the Racial Justice Team

Dear Friends,

On September 29, friends and partners of Valley of Peace, as well as our racial justice partner church House of Hope, attended the play Behind the Sun at St. Paul's History Theatre. The play focuses on the true story of a Black family's experiences buying a home in 1956 in a Whites-only area of St. Paul.

The difficulties were many. No bank would give the family a loan to cover the down payment to purchase a house in this area. In addition, there were racial covenants in the deeds of these homes that precluded their sale to Blacks. And, while there had been a 1948 Supreme Court Decision that such racial covenants were legally unenforceable, an informal agreement among local real estate agents not to sell homes to Blacks allowed this discriminatory practice to continue.

The Black family was able to accumulate enough for a down payment only because the wife had a fulltime job and her husband worked two fulltime jobs. Even then, only through a successful ruse of the local real estate agent (with the help of a white couple that were the Black couple's long-time friends) were they able to finalize the sale. When they moved in, a three-month campaign by Whites to scare them out of the neighborhood began. This included, among other things, the ringing of their doorbell by persons unknown, carloads of Whites who cruised the neighborhood shouting out their hatred, young boys who picked fights with their sons, several gunshots that hit their house, and a brick thrown through one of their windows. Mercifully, after three weeks, most of the open hostility ended.

Almost a decade later, Blacks were still having difficulty moving into Whites-only neighborhoods for some of the same reasons. My dad was president of a savings-and-loan in Columbus, Ohio and in 1964 he shared with me a letter he had received from the chairman of the housing committee of a nearby suburban community's human relations council. The letter thanked him "for the helpful part you played in obtaining a loan" for a Black family that wished to purchase a home in a development specifically designed to be a multiracial community. The rest of the letter made it clear that other banks in the area had not been willing to provide "mortgage money without regard to the race of the purchaser." The State of Minnesota, fortunately, passed legislation in 1962 prohibiting housing discrimination on the basis of race, religion, and national origin.

A Note from the Racial Justice Team Continued...

Nevertheless, informal barriers were still apparent elsewhere nearly another decade later. In 1971, when my wife and I were looking in the northern suburbs of New York City for our first house, we told our real estate agent we hoped to find a home in a multiracial area. We had grown up in an all-White suburb and wanted a different experience for our children. The agent said that this was an unusual request. Many of the people he helped find homes asked for the exact opposite.

Today, remnants of this discriminatory system still persist, even if they are no longer being enforced. A number of communities, including Golden Valley, are encouraging homeowners to remove racial covenants from their deeds. And Robbinsdale is considering changing the name of Sanborn Park. As a recent Sun Post article [September 19, 2024] states: "Sanborn Park was named after a family that owned property in the city and often added racial covenants to the land they owned." When they sold their properties to others, "[T]hey would write something like 'the premises hereby conveyed shall not at any time be conveyed, mortgaged or leased to any person or persons of Chinese, Japanese, Moorish, Turkish, Negro, Mongolian or African blood or descent."

Unfortunately, the impact of many of these past restrictions (and, over time, of a number of discriminatory federal housing programs) persists in the form of less generational wealth for the impacted groups. This issue also needs to be addressed.

VoP Lower Level Improvement Progress Report

At the Annual Meeting in May, the Congregation approved a contract with our Architect, Miller Dunwiddie, for the final design, bidding and construction plan phase. This phase provides a level of detail for 3 or 4 selected General Contractors to bid on the project and for budgeting.

Since approval was given to proceed, we have held a number of meetings with our Architect, AGCLC, and some of the VoP Ladies most frequently working in the kitchen for various events.

We experienced about a 7-week delay this past summer with our primary Architect for the project on medical leave.

With the Design Review set approximately 95/98% complete, this is our current status ...

Detailed plans and elevations for areas being considered for improvements – Kitchen, Fellowship Hall, a new ADA Restroom and Storage for table and chairs.

<u>Kitchen</u>

- Selected flooring and wall surface covering
- Decision made to use Induction Pods for frying surfaces (no gas, no emissions)
- 2 Convection Ovens stacked
- 1 Refrigerator
- Quartz Serving Counter
- Motorized rolling counter doors (serving counter and dirty dishes)

<u>Fellowship Hall</u>

- Selected flooring and paint for walls
- Decided on a design for the front (kitchen-end) of the Fellowship Hall
- New windows (non-opening)
- New lighting

ADA Restroom

• Selected flooring, ceramic wall tiles and paint for this room

With the plans nearly complete, Rapids Kitchen Supply will work closely with the Architect to provide the final MEP (mechanical, electrical, plumbing) rough-in detail, which is needed by General Contractors to bid appropriately.

I feel quite confident we should be able to put the project out for RFP's (Request For Proposals) within three weeks.

As we move along with the Project, we will work closely with AGCLC to minimize the construction impact on their daily activities. AGCLC are the ones that will be most impacted during a construction phase.

With our outstanding member commitment to Rejoice & Renew, we feel confident in our ability to upgrade VoP's Lower Level.




Nov 6: The False White Gospel, by Jim Wallis

"For more than fifty years, Jim Wallis has been calling on his fellow white evangelicals to live up to the teachings at the heart of their shared faith: loving their neighbors, doing justice, and pursuing peace. Without shying away from hard truths, *The False White Gospel* draws on Christianity itself to point the way forward to a multiracial democracy in which people of all faiths can flourish." 304 pages. <u>This will be our last session on this book</u>.



Nov 20: Our Hidden Conversations, by Michelle Norris

We will be reading this book through December. A very powerful and hopeful book on race, started with the Postcard Project and turned into a book with more complete stories and photos. The author is a journalist who quit NPR to do this research. She collected MANY short responses to her question about how each of us feels about race. She took the responses, organized them cleverly, then took a deep dive into some of them. Easy to read a bit at a time. The interviews are varied and culturally diverse. Not just about black/white issues; the responses cover other groups too. Each original postcard response was to be 6 words or less. My personal favorite is "underneath, we all taste like chicken," although most were quite serious, many were angry and many remained hopeful. A wonderful cross section of American thoughts and sensitivities.


