

A Word From Pastor Ashley Osborn

As we step into January, the first month of a brand-new year, it is natural to pause, reflect, and dream of the year ahead. New Year's resolutions often capture this spirit of renewal, serving as reminders of who we aspire to be and what we hope to accomplish. Few examples capture this better than folk singer Woody Guthrie's handwritten list of 33 New Year's Resolutions from 1943. While Guthrie was known for his powerful songs that inspired and uplifted, his simple resolutions reflect something deeper—a spirit of hope.

Titled "New Year's Rulin's", Guthrie's list balances small, practical goals with grander aspirations. "Work more and better," he wrote. "Wash teeth if any," he added with a bit of humor. He resolved to "Read lots good books," "Help win war" (a nod to WWII), and "Love everybody." Scrawled among these were resolutions to "Keep hope machine running," a phrase that resonates with us even today. In just a few words, Guthrie captured the essence of what hope is: active, persistent, and necessary.

For Christians, hope is more than optimism; it is rooted in faith and God's promises. Romans 15:13 reminds us: "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." This hope is not just for ourselves, but something we carry into the world—a "hope machine" fueled by faith and shared with others. As Guthrie's resolutions reflect, hope is not passive. It requires action: loving others, working diligently, reading, learning, and tending to our bodies and spirits.

As a church family, let us begin this year with our own "Rulin's"—simple acts that reflect our commitment to hope and love. Perhaps we resolve to pray more, to volunteer, to reach out to someone in need, or to simply be kind. Like Guthrie, we can keep our hope machines running, no matter what challenges come our way.

In 1943, Woody Guthrie's list of resolutions reminded him to do the little things well while keeping his eyes on something greater. May we, too, walk into this new year with hearts full of hope, ready to do good work, trust in God's grace, and love one another.

Let's keep our hope machines running.

COST


The cost of the retreat is \$285 per person. This includes two nights of lodging, 5 meals, and materials. Scholarships may be available, please check with your Pastor.




