A Word From Pastor Ashley Osborn

We are now in the season of Lent. And this Lent at Valley of Peace, we are centering our life together on the promises we make in the Covenant of Baptism: to live, hear, proclaim, serve, and strive.

In a season when many are feeling unsettled and carrying anxiety, grief, and fatigue, these baptismal promises can ground us and center us. They remind us who we are and whose we are.

Each Wednesday in Lent, we will explore one of these promises in worship. We will ask what it looks like not just in the church, but in our daily life. What does it mean to live among God's faithful people in a lonely world? To hear God's Word when so many other voices compete for our attention? To proclaim hope, serve neighbors, and strive for justice and peace right here in this time and place?

Throughout the season, members of our congregation will share brief reflections on how these promises show up in their every day lives; at work, school, in neighborhoods, and in quiet acts of faithfulness.

You are invited to join us each Wednesday for Soup Supper starting at 5:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall and Worship in the Sanctuary at 6:30 p.m. using the Holden Evening Prayer liturgy.

Lent is not about doing more. It is about returning, and this year returning to the waters of baptism, to community, and to the steady love of God that holds us in every season.



Lower Level Renovation Update “Highlights”

- Renovation progressing nicely. The goal is to have the kitchen available in time to prepare the VoP Palm Sunday Brunch.
- Sheetrock for new walls installed, taped and sanded. We have two easily identifiable new spaces for storage and an ADA Restroom.
- Fiberglass reinforced panels have been mounted in the kitchen area where appliances, sinks and work surfaces will line the walls.
- Electrical work on-going. Surface outlets, switches, etc., are being installed.
- Roofers have cleared back the ice and rock and cut back the roofing membrane on the East and South flat roof in preparation for fresh air intake and exhaust penetrations.
- Temporary shelters put in place to eliminate any moisture seeping into the building from planned roof cuts.

The week of February 23 ...

- roof cutting and installation of reinforcing rebar
- roof membrane replacement
- cabinetry being delivered

Looking ahead - plan is to replace Fellowship Hall windows while AGC is on spring break - 3/30-4/3

A Note From the Racial Justice Team

In this time of upheaval across our State many Minnesotans have taken action to prevent further turmoil in our communities. We've observed eye-opening injustices against our neighbors. We've engaged in deep conversations about our beliefs. We've written letters, signed petitions, made phone calls, stood outside in subzero temperatures, marched with masses of neighbors, rung bells, and lit candles on street corners to convey our message of unity in the face of injustice. Surely, God is at work among us.

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." Isaiah 43:19

We are being given a glimpse into the way out of the 'wilderness' and 'wasteland' of hate, fear and brutality. Do we perceive it? The Holy Spirit inspires us to step beyond our comfort by standing up for what is right. We are empowered by God's love to be the prophetic voice and moral vision of our context. What is God's will for God's people?

Scripture makes clear God's desire for inclusive communities, for treating the immigrants among us as our own people, and above all, loving one another. In all our diversity we are joining together for our common good. We can create something new – something that allows all of us to live, move and have our being – no matter the color of our skin or where we were born. People of faith, it is our call and our joy to follow through on creating communities where every person feels and is safe. It is restorative justice we seek.

From the National Center on Restorative Justice (NCORJ.org): Restorative justice is both a set of practices and a broad philosophy with applicability across contexts. Contemporary restorative justice practice and philosophy have roots and resonances with various Indigenous, religious, and other cultural traditions from around the world.

Restorative justice prioritizes building, maintaining, and repairing relationships. It aims to generate a space in which all people are valued and respected and all voices are heard.

Restorative justice is attentive to the interconnected nature of communities and endeavors to strengthen those bonds and repair harms when they occur.

Restorative justice is an inclusive, dialogic approach that provides an opportunity to hear from the people most directly impacted and practice collective decision-making to address the harm. Restorative justice invites participation from those most directly impacted, those responsible for harm, and their communities of care. Participation is voluntary for all.

March 1: *Words That Act-The Bible's Wisdom, Comfort, Hope & Resolve* with Pastor Wade Wacholz

One of the ways we understand the Bible as "God's Word" is its power to affect us and others. The words of the Bible comfort, exhort, teach and strengthen us. We experience caring, love and hope in its passages. From the Bible we become wiser, more resolved, gentler and more resilient. Let's explore some key texts from scripture that do specific things, for us and for others - texts we can lean on, pray with and share because of what God does in and through them.

March 8: *Christian Nationalism with Pastor Chris Bellefeuille*

Together we will examine questions like: What is Christian nationalism, and how is it different from Christianity? How is it different from patriotism? How should Christians respond to Christian nationalism? How does this movement affect us and our nation?

March 15: *MLK's Letter from the Birmingham Jail with Paul Mikelson*

"Martin Luther King's Letter from the Birmingham Jail" - this is perhaps the most compelling argument ever written about the need for non-violent protests to promote social action. Paul Mikelson will present the letter and its impact on civil rights activity, the 1964 Civil Rights Act as well as implications for today's need for non-violent protest. Please attend and participate in this important discussion!

March 22: *What to Say & Not to Say to a Hurting Person* with Pastor Karen Geisendorfer-Lindgren

The human soul doesn't want to be advised or fixed or saved. It simply wants to be witnessed exactly as it is.

Parker Palmer On March 22nd our focus will be "What to say and not to say to a hurting person"

Pastor Karen Geisendorfer-Lindgren will lead us in a discussion of this topic, sharing insights from scripture and daily life. We will also have the opportunity to learn from each other as we share our own experiences of navigating times of grief and pain.

March 29: *Study of the Book of Revelation (Part 7) with Pastor Laurie Eaton*

After Satan is thrown from heaven and goes stalking the earth, the imagery and symbolism of Revelation become even more difficult and terrifying. The bowl plagues (Rev. 16) are twice as intense as the trumpets (Rev 8-9).

How are we to interpret this violence? Barbara Rossing is convinced that the book of Revelation is a gift that promotes healing for the world, not violence and destruction. Still, we must deal with the elements of Revelation that are so problematic. We also must acknowledge the ways this book has been invoked to justify violence on the part of Jesus' follower.

This lesson examines two related problems: how to deal with the violent legacy of Revelation in public culture today; and how to navigate the violence in the second half of the book. We will learn how to reframe our interpretation of the violent passages in terms of the Bible's story of exodus and liberation, not the violence of cruelty or war. It is not necessary to have been to previous sessions to learn.




