A Word From Pastor Ashley Osborn

There is a particular kind of hope that arrives quietly.

It does not announce itself with certainty or confidence. It does not erase the heaviness we may still be carrying. Instead, it comes in small, almost unnoticed ways; the softening of the ground, the lengthening of the light, the first brave shoots of green pushing up through soil that only weeks ago felt frozen and lifeless.

This year, for me, it came in the form of an orchid.

Now, I should say this is the first time I have ever kept an orchid alive (perhaps you have already heard me bragging about this). Orchids have not always been the most forgiving plant for me. With this particular plant, there were long stretches where it looked like nothing was happening. The blooms had fallen. The stems were bare. At times, it seemed like I was simply tending to something that had already run its course.

And yet, I kept watering. I kept it in the light. I stayed with it, even when it like an exercise in futility, and even when my family gave me a hard time for sticking with it.

And then, slowly, something began to change. A small green shoot. A hint of new growth. And eventually, a bloom.

We are people who have just walked (or will soon be walking) through the long shadows of Holy Week. We have sat around the table and heard the story of Jesus' last supper. We have stood at the cross. We have felt the weight of silence in the tomb. And then we hear again the good news of Easter morning: life where there should be none, hope where it seemed lost, love that refuses to be buried.

But here is the truth we live with after Easter Sunday: resurrection is not only a moment. It is a way of seeing and being.

Because most of life looks less like an empty tomb and more like an orchid between blooming seasons. There are long stretches where nothing seems to be happening. Where prayers feel unanswered. Where growth is invisible. Where hope feels fragile at best. We wonder if anything is still alive beneath the surface.

And still, God is at work.

Spring does not burst forth all at once. It unfolds. Slowly. Patiently. One sign of life at a time.

A Word From Pastor Ashley Osborn Continued...

Maybe resurrection works that way in us, too. Not always in dramatic transformations, but in subtle shifts. A moment of unexpected peace. A conversation that brings healing. The courage to begin again. The willingness to forgive. The strength to keep going when we thought we could not. Or simply this: staying with something; tending to it; trusting that life may still be there, even when we cannot see it.

This is what the orchid taught me this year and this is what our Easter promise is. That resurrection and new life is rarely loud, but it is always real. And we are called to notice it; in the small green shoots, in the quiet acts of love, in moments of hope that surprises us. And, if we pay attention to stories of resurrection, we will see it happening all around us.

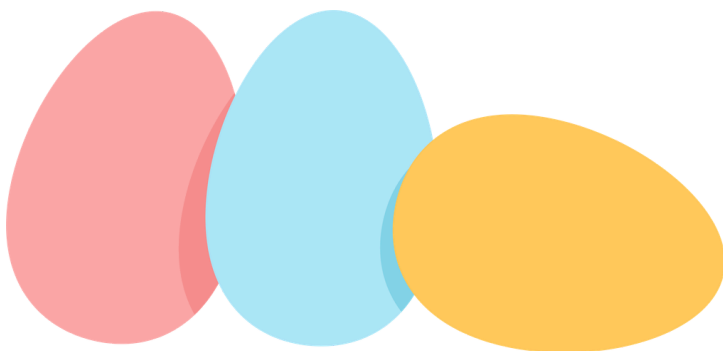

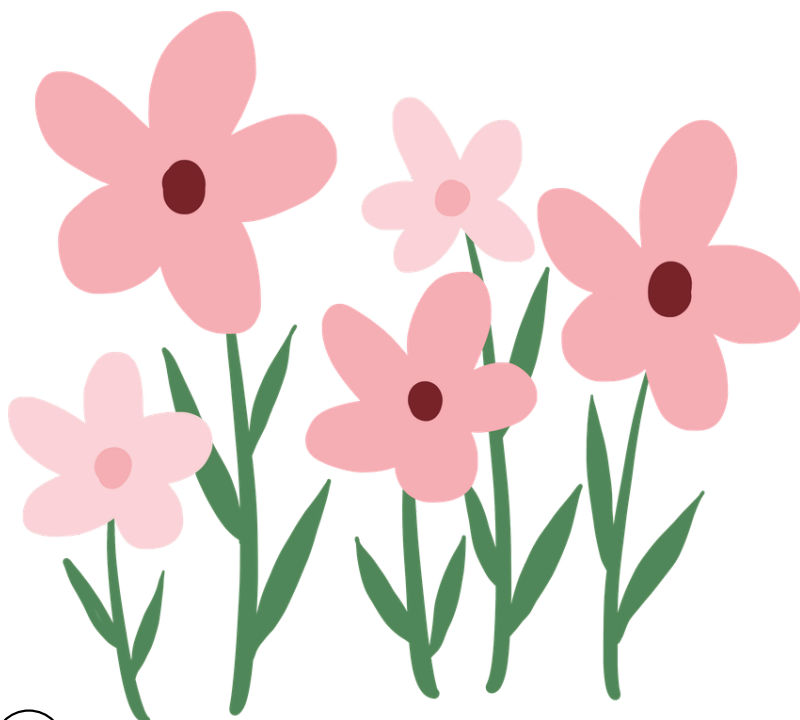
