# A Word From Pastor Ashley Osborn



As summer begins at Valley of Peace, we are excited to enter into a new worship series together centered around Faith & Neighboring Practices. Throughout the summer, we will explore simple but meaningful ways that God forms us in faith and calls us into relationship with one another and our community.

This series is inspired by the Minneapolis Area Synod Faith & Neighboring Practices initiative. This is a learning community that encourages congregations to practice curiosity, deep listening, and connection within the neighborhoods where God has called us to be church. The initiative invites churches to shift their focus from scarcity and problems toward possibility, relationship, and abundance as we trust that God is already at work around and through all of people and neighborhoods. We have a team of 6 people from Valley of Peace who are part of our Faith & Neighboring Practices Cohort.

For us at Valley of Peace, this neighboring work feels especially meaningful in this season. As we move through the final stages of our building projects, we are also beginning to ask new questions about how we are called beyond our walls and more deeply into our neighborhood. After a long season of construction, planning, and transitions, summer feels like the right time to turn our attention to our community; to slow down, reconnect, and notice where God is already present among our neighbors and in the everyday places of our lives.

Each week this summer we will engage spiritual practices like listening, prayer, faith mapping, hospitality, and more as we recognize the gifts already present in us and among us. These practices remind us that faith is not something we only experience inside our church walls, but something that shapes how we live, notice, and connect in daily life.

One of the things I love about this series is that it invites us to see God's abundance. In a world that so often focuses on fear, division, or scarcity, we will spend the summer paying attention to the many gifts God has already placed within our congregation and throughout our neighborhood.

This series also gives us opportunities to grow closer as a congregation through worship, conversations, small groups, and neighborhood engagement. I hope to deepen our relationships with one another while learning how to live out our faith in daily life.

I also invite you to check out in this Voice and in upcoming church communication more information about summer small groups, neighboring opportunities, and additional ways to participate throughout this season. There will be many ways for all ages to engage, connect, and explore together this summer!

## A Heartfelt Thank You from the Worship & Music Team!

Our community raised \$890 through freewill offerings at our Lenten soup suppers. The church rounded this up to donate a total of \$900 to support local immigrant-owned businesses.

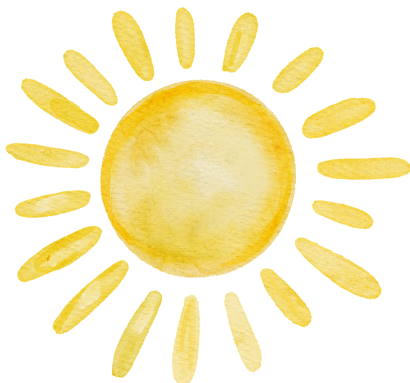

# Mission of the Month: Exodus Lending

Have you ever wanted to provide direct impactful relief to your neighbors? Give a gift that keeps replenishing and serving the community?

Born out of an ELCA church asking questions about their neighborhood, Exodus Lending works to advocate for laws that protect consumers from predatory loans. Meanwhile they have paid off 1,400 predatory loans and allowed Minnesotans to pay back those loans to Exodus Lending. Taking these loans from an average APR of 272% to 0%. Loan repayments are reinvested to pay off another Minnesotan's predatory loan.

For the last few years Exodus has been asking the question, how can we prevent our neighbors from getting into a predatory loan? The Resiliency Loan program was created. Working with 30 nonprofit partners across the state. Through Exodus these partners are able to offer a 0% APR Resiliency Loan as part of their programming. Exodus Lending is able to administer these loans for the partner organizations.

After years of educating legislatures and advocating for reform MN passed a 36% rate cap on loans. Myself and many other VOP members have been part of this advocacy. The 36% rate cap effectively closed down the payday loan industry in MN. However the work continues. This legislative session Exodus focused on payday loan apps (which the industry calls early wage access) - high cost loans available over an app which carry the same high fees and reborrowing traps that storefront payday loan shops did before the 36% rate cap in MN. This industry is rapidly expanding and trying to pass legislation in states across the country to exempt themselves from consumer financial protections. Exodus Lending program participants who have refinanced from these products with Exodus testified about how harmful they are. Exodus Lending along with coalition partners were able to stop the predatory loan industry efforts at deregulation!
